



## PE and Sport Premium Funding

### **What is the PE and Sport Premium?**

Following the London 2012 Olympic and Paralympic Games, the Government made the decision to provide funding for schools to secure a significant and lasting legacy for the children. The PE and Sport Premium is designed to help primary schools improve the quality of the PE and sport activities they offer their pupils.

The aim is to develop an enjoyment of sport and physical activity, and to promote a healthy lifestyle in children from an early age. Schools receive Physical Education (PE) and Sport Premium funding based on the number of pupils in Years 3 to 6.

### **How to use the PE and Sport Premium:**

Schools must use the funding to make additional and sustainable improvements to the quality of PE and sport you offer.

This means that the Academy should use the premium to:

- develop or add to the PE and sport activities that your school already offers
- build capacity and capability within the school to ensure that improvements made now will benefit pupils joining the school in future years

There are 5 key indicators that schools should expect to see improvement across:

- the engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity - the Chief Medical Officer guidelines recommend that all children and young people aged 5 to 18 engage in at least 60 minutes of physical activity a day, of which 30 minutes should be in school
- the profile of PE and sport is raised across the school as a tool for whole-school improvement
- increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport
- broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils
- increased participation in competitive sport

Schools must spend the additional funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but have the freedom to choose how they do this. For example, schools can use their funding to:

- provide staff with professional development, mentoring, training and resources to help them teach PE and sport more effectively
- hire qualified sports coaches to work with teachers to enhance or extend current opportunities
- introduce new sports, dance or other activities to encourage more pupils to take up sport and physical activities
- support and involve the least active children by providing targeted activities, and running or extending school sports and holiday clubs

- enter or run more sport competitions
- partner with other schools to run sports activities and clubs
- increase pupils' participation in the [School Games](#)
- encourage pupils to take on leadership or volunteer roles that support sport and physical activity within the school
- provide additional swimming provision targeted to pupils not able to meet the swimming requirements of the national curriculum
- embed physical activity into the school day through active travel to and from school, active playgrounds and active teaching



## How we plan to use the PE and Sports Premium in 2017/18:

We expect to receive funding of £20,500 during the academic year. We plan to spend it as detailed below:
